ORDER GRANTING PLAINTIFFS' RULE 41(a)(2)
MOTION TO DISMISS CERTAIN CLAIMS

Pending before the Court is Plaintiffs'¹ motion to dismiss all claims for relief with the express exception of their equitable claims for public nuisance and all remedies which the Plaintiffs may recover from any Defendant upon proof of public nuisance liability (Transaction ID 66950343).

Accordingly, it is hereby **ORDERED** that Plaintiffs' Rule 41(a)(2) Motion to Dismiss Certain Claims without prejudice is **GRANTED**; and

All claims for relief for these Plaintiffs with the express exception of these Plaintiffs' equitable claims for public nuisance are hereby dismissed without prejudice.
