**ORDER PERMITTING LOCAL COUNSEL TO ATTEND
DEPOSITIONS BY TELEPHONIC OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS**

Defendants Nicolon Corporation d/b/a/ TenCate Geosynthetics Americas, formerly d/b/a TenCate Geosynthetics North America (“TenCate”), Engineered Arresting Systems Corporation, d/b/a Zodiac Arresting Systems America (“Zodiac”), The Travelers Indemnity Company (“Travelers”), Ohio Farmers Insurance Company (“Ohio Farmers”), and New Hampshire Insurance Company (“NHIC”) presented an *Unopposed Joint Motion to Permit Local Counsel to Attend Depositions by Telephone or Other Electronic Means* (Transaction ID 61761983). Rule 8.0(b) of the Rules for Admission to the Practice of Law provides in part that, “Local counsel shall further attend the taking of depositions and other events that occur in proceedings that are not actually conducted before the judge, tribunal or other body of the State of West Virginia, unless the presiding judge permits local counsel to appear by telephone or other electronic means.”

Having considered counsel’s unopposed motion, the Panel hereby **ORDERS** that local counsel shall be permitted to attend depositions by telephonic or other electronic means pursuant

to Rule 8.0(b) of the Rules for Admission to the Practice of Law, provided that all counsel maintain civility and professionalism in conducting depositions. If the Court is advised that counsel is unable to maintain civility and professionalism, the Panel will vacate this order and require local counsel to attend the taking of all depositions in person.

It is so **ORDERED**.
