**ORDER DENYING PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR PROTECTION
TO LIMIT THE SCOPE OF EXPERT DEPOSITIONS**

THIS MATTER comes before the Court on *Plaintiffs' Motion for Protection to Limit the Scope of Expert Depositions* (Transaction ID 58880725). Having reviewed the motion, as well as Defendants' opposition to the motion, and having conferred with one another to insure uniformity of their decision, as contemplated by Rule 26.07(a) of the West Virginia Trial Court Rules, the Court DENIES the motion on the ground that Plaintiffs have not shown good cause to limit the depositions of their expert witnesses, Dr. Baskin and Dr. Cabrera, to seven hours each to be completed in one day.

Likewise, the Court DENIES Defendants' request that the Court "issue an order establishing time limits for all expert depositions based on criteria set out in Pfizer's proposal." Because Defendants have agreed to limit the depositions of Plaintiffs' expert witnesses, Dr. Baskin and Dr. Cabrera, to a total of ten hours each their proposal is

GRANTED. The parties are ORDERED to meet and confer and to resolve any further disagreements regarding limitation of expert witness depositions.

It is so ORDERED.
