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Transition Services


- Our goals are simple:

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The WVBE will provide a statewide system of education that ensures **all students** graduate from high school prepared for success in high-quality post-secondary opportunities in college and/or careers.



Career-Integrated Experiential Learning (CIEL)

Concentration Options for Students enrolled in both Long Term and Short Term Institutional settings.





- Students who enroll in a **Career-Integrated Experiential Learning concentration (CIEL)** have the opportunity to complete traditional or virtual courses from a CTE concentration.
- CIEL concentration ensures that the remaining courses within the concentration **may be substituted with the Ready to Work Certification course, the Entrepreneurial Preparedness course or experiential learning.**

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Experiential Learning

- A student enrolled in the CIEL concentration can receive one credit toward completer status for 135 hours.
- A student completing 270 hours will be awarded two credits.

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

Transition Services



Providing student centered transition services to link, refer and advocate throughout West Virginia communities and schools in collaboration with state and private agencies.

MISSION

Prepare juveniles and adults for successful transition to school, employment, and to life in their communities as responsible, productive citizens

Transition

1. Establish a transition process for all students from facilities in West Virginia, as well as out-of-state to the community including public school
2. Identification of technical and community based resources based on individual students' needs
3. Collaboration with statewide services such as DHHR, Post-Secondary
4. Link, refer, and advocate for student at various levels regarding transition
5. Coordinate with counselor/life skills instructor regarding re-entry and aftercare planning
6. Work with community agencies for grant opportunities (Modify, Workforce WV, Job Corp, Higher Education, mentoring, etc.)
7. Coordinate with community resources for the student
8. Follow-up services, track progress, and data collection for one year post discharge
9. Assist counselor with ACT test registration and preparation, FAFSA applications, college applications
10. Attend and participate in court proceedings MDT, regular/special education related events

Welcome to Institutional Education Programs Student Transition

Education is a fundamental right of all students. However, some students face unique educational challenges, as they have been placed in facilities in and out of the state of West Virginia for adjudicated and status related offenses, psychiatric treatment, or specialized medical needs. These are the students the WVDE OIEP Transition Specialists work closely with; to ensure they are able to enroll in public school or higher education, complete their high school graduation tracks, seek and obtain employment, and develop necessary skills to be successful young adults. Transition Specialists foster the necessary personal relationship with students while providing a consistent education advocate. Throughout WV, Transition Specialists work with students, aged 5-21, placed in the state's 21 juvenile facilities and students who have been court ordered to complete out-of-state treatment.
