Date, location of Greenbrier County MOU ceremony has changed

LEWISBURG, W.Va. – A ceremony celebrating the signing of an agreement between court officials and educators in Greenbrier County has been postponed by a several days.

The Memorandum of Understanding is now scheduled to be signed at 10:30 a.m. on Monday, April 9, at the Greenbrier County Courthouse in Lewisburg.

The Greenbrier County Board of Education has agreed to fund an additional probation officer in Greenbrier County who will work in schools full-time to help educators identify student behavior and attendance problems earlier. Identification is the first step toward intervening in the students' lives to keep them in school and out of the court system. The Greenbrier County Board, led by President Kathy King, voted March 13 to pay for the additional probation officer. The effort was supported by Superintendent John Curry.

They and Eleventh Judicial Circuit Judge James J. Rowe, Chief Probation Officer Fred Taylor, and Supreme Court Director of Probation Services Mike Lacy will sign the document at the ceremony.

Similar cooperative agreements between circuit courts and county boards of education exist in Mercer, Monongalia, Wayne, Logan, and Boone Counties. The programs are part of the Supreme Court's anti-truancy initiative led by Justice Robin Jean Davis.
