### **E-filing to be discussed on this week's "The Law Works"** For immediate release

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – In West Virginia, filing a lawsuit will soon be cheaper, easier, and faster than ever before.

This week's episode of "The Law Works" will feature electronic courts and e-filing.

Host Dan Ringer and guests Matt Arrowood, Supreme Court Director of Circuit Clerk Services; Barbara Core, a consultant with On-Line Information Services, Inc.; and Michael Manley, President of Software Systems, Inc., will discuss the process of e-filing and what it means to lawyers and *pro se* litigants.

The Supreme Court is in the middle of a pilot project with fourteen counties who are on track to offer e-filing in their courts.

Marion County was the first county online and Jefferson County will be online in the next few weeks. The other counties include Berkeley, Braxton, Cabell, Hampshire, Harrison, Lewis, Lincoln, Morgan, Ohio, Randolph, Upshur, and Wood.
