Judge to read at Kanawha school for Black History Month

CHARLESTON, W.Va. – Thirteenth Judicial Circuit (Kanawha County) Judge Tod Kaufman will read to fourth-grade students at Mary C. Snow West Side Elementary School at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, February 4, in honor of Black History Month.

The school is located at 100 Florida St., Charleston.

Judge Kaufman's presentation is part of the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia's Robes to Schools program. Then-Chief Justice Robin Jean Davis launched the program in 2007 to encourage active and retired justices, circuit judges, family court judges and magistrates to make regular appearances in West Virginia schools.
