Kanawha Magistrate to appear at school in honor of Dr. Seuss' birthday

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.Va. – Kanawha County Magistrate Julie Yeager will deliver the “Reader’s Oath” in honor of Dr. Seuss’ birthday to students at Montrose Elementary School 8 a.m. Monday, February 29. The school is located at 631 Montrose Drive, South Charleston.

This will be the ninth year that Magistrate Yeager has appeared at Montrose Elementary in honor of Read Across America Day, an annual event held on or near the March 2 birthday of the late Theodor Seuss Geisel (better known as Dr. Seuss.)

Students usually wear *Cat in the Hat* hats, dye their hair, wear feather boas and generally alter their appearance in the spirit of Dr. Seuss for the day.

Magistrate Yeager’s participation is part of the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia’s *Robes to Schools* program. The goal of *Robes to Schools* is to have active and retired justices, circuit judges, family court judges, and magistrates make regular appearances in West Virginia schools.

The "Reader’s Oath" was written by Debra Angstead of Missouri and says in part:

Each day and each night
I know it’s the key
To growing up right.*
