New Monongalia Circuit Judge Investiture to be June 29

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. – Newly elected Seventeenth Judicial Circuit (Monongalia County) Judge Cindy Scott will be sworn into office at 11 a.m. Monday, June 29, in Courtroom No. 3 in the Monongalia County Justice Center in Morgantown.

Senior Status Judge Russell M. Clawges, Jr., will administer the oath of office.

Judge-Elect Scott was elected June 9 to the unexpired term of Judge Clawges, who retired in January 2019. The term ends December 31, 2024.

Judge-Elect Scott is a native of Morgantown. She graduated from Morgantown High School in 1982 and in 1986 earned a bachelor's degree in Business Administration from West Virginia University. She worked briefly in banking before returning to the West Virginia University College of Law where she earned a law degree in 1994.

Judge-Elect Scott worked at the Morgantown law firm Oliver & Yackel and subsequently The Law Office of Raymond Yackel before joining the Monongalia County Prosecutor's Office in 2006. When elected, she was Assistant Director of Equity Assurance at West Virginia University, where she spent three years addressing discrimination and harassment by investigating complaints, assisting faculty, staff and students and aiding in rendering decisions involving alleged violations of WVU's rules and policies.

She and her husband, Todd Scott, live in Morgantown and have two adult children, Brent and Jensen. They regularly attend Kingdom Evangelical Methodist Church.
