Supreme Court, National Guard Make Video About Workplace Best Practices

CHARLESTON, W.Va. – As courts throughout West Virginia begin resuming additional in-person proceedings, the West Virginia National Guard and the Supreme Court Administrative Office have worked together to produce a "State of West Virginia Workplace Best Practices Video" that is now available on the National Guard's YouTube Channel.

The video was filmed at Supreme Court Administrative Offices at City Center East in Charleston and at the Putnam County Judicial Center. The video includes a specific section dealing with best practices for cleaning courthouses and courtrooms. Portions of the video may not be applicable or possible in all facilities. However, the hope is that employees can take the general concepts from the video and apply them to their own facilities as they return to work following reduced operations and COVID-19 related office and courthouse closures.
