Rules of Judicial Disciplinary Procedure

Rule 1.1. Membership

The Commission shall consist of nine members: <u>five members of the judiciary, including</u> three circuit judges, one magistrate, one family court judge, <u>provided that any members of</u> <u>the judiciary may be senior status;</u> one <u>from the following categories - mental hygiene</u> commissioner, juvenile referee, special commissioner, special master, or former <u>state or</u> <u>federal</u> judge or justice, state or federal, and three members of the public.
