Pending before the Mass Litigation Panel ("Panel") is the *Motion to Allow Presentation* of Direct Witness Testimony by Declaration (Transaction ID 67861388), filed by Plaintiff, the State of West Virginia, ex rel. Patrick Morrisey, pursuant to W. Va. T.C.R. 26.05(a). Upon review of the State's Motion and the Pharmacy Defendants' Opposition (Transaction ID 67913568), the Motion is **GRANTED IN PART AND DENIED IN PART** as follows:

1. The parties shall be allowed to present the qualifications and experience of any expert witness through a written declaration. Any exhibits referenced in a witness's declaration shall be filed with the declaration.

2. Declarations are due by 12 pm two days before the witness is scheduled to testify, although the Parties are encouraged to file their witness declarations as soon as possible. If a witness is scheduled to testify on a Monday or Tuesday, their declaration must be filed by 12pm the preceding Friday.

3. No other written declarations will be allowed.

All exceptions and objections are noted and preserved for the record.
