Dear

Counsel for the Judicial Investigation Commission has referred your request for an advisory opinion to the Commission for its consideration. In your request you ask whether you may use the State Seal immediately over your title, Judge County Circuit Court, County Courthouse, West Virginia , on your campaign literature. The members of the Commission have reviewed your request and have determined that such use would be improper.

The use of the State Seal with your official title and the courthouse address would create an appearance of impropriety. Furthermore, the use of the State Seal and your name and courthouse address would lend itself to an appearance of official stationery and would not be appropriate on campaign materials. The Commission has reviewed the language in Canon 2 in reaching its opinion. Analogous opinions have been issued in New York and Indiana -NY Office of Ct. Administration, Op. 129 (1978); Ind. Comm'n on Judicial Qualifications, Op. U 4 (1984).

The language contained in memorandum which you cite in your inquiry would cover the use of a bumper sticker on your private automobile if the vehicle were on court premises.
