JIC Advisory Opinion 1992-14

Dear Judge

Your recent correspondence to Counsel for the Judicial Investigation Commission has been referred to the full Commission for its consideration. In that letter you asked if a judge or a judicial candidate can participate as a delegate in the Democratic or Republican National Convention. After reviewing your correspondence, the Commission feels that it would not be appropriate for a judge or judicial candidate to participate as a delegate in the Democratic or Republican National Convention.

This opinion is based upon the pertinent language contained in Canon 7A (2) and (4). This language states:

Canon 7

A Judge Should Refrain from Political Activity
Inappropriate to His Judicial Office

A. Political Conduct in General.

(2) A judge may attend political gatherings, speak to such gatherings on subjects permitted under Canon 4A, [A judge may speak, write, lecture, teach, and participate in other activities concerning the law, legal system, and the administration of justice.] identify himself as a member of a political party, and contribute to a political party or political organization recognized by law.

The Honorable - 2 - June 30, 1992

(4) A judge should not engage in any other political activity except on behalf of measures to improve the law, the legal system, or the administration of justice.

These provisions of Canon 7 would preclude a judge or judicial candidate from participating as a delegate in the Democratic or Republican National Convention. If you have any further questions regarding this matter, do not hesitate to contact the Commission.
