Dear

The Judicial Investigation Commission at its recent meeting reviewed an advisory opinion dated August 9, 1994, in which an opinion was given to a Family Law Master who had previously been an attorney with the Child Advocate's Office. It addressed cases the Family Law Master could hear which had been pending when he served in the Child Advocate's Office. Basically, the opinion said that any case in which the Family Law Master had been involved as an attorney for the Child Advocate's Office would require his recusal when it came before him as a Family Law Master. A copy of this opinion is enclosed for your review.

The Commission has reviewed that opinion and determined that it should still be dispositive in certain matters involving the recusal of the Family Court Judge. If the Family Court Judge had been involved in a case while an attorney with the Child Advocate's Office, that judge would be required to recuse himself/herself if that case came before the court at any subsequent time.
