Re: JIC Advisory Opinion 2015-26.

Dear

Your recent request for an advisory opinion was reviewed by the Judicial Investigation Commission. The factual scenario giving rise to your request is as follows: You are a candidate for circuit judge. You would like to know if a city councilwoman who is not currently running for office can serve as a host for a meet and greet social for you as a judicial candidate.

The Commission has reviewed Rules 4.1(A)(3) and 4.2(A)(1) and (2) of the Code of Judicial Conduct and its commentary to address the question which you have raised. Rule 4.1(A)(3) states that "a judge or judicial candidate shall not publicly endorse or oppose a candidate for any public office." Rule 4.2 provides in pertinent part:

- (A) A judge or candidate subject to public election shall:
 - (1) act at all times in a manner consistent with the independence, integrity, and impartiality of the judiciary;
 - (2) Comply with all applicable election, election campaign, and election campaign fund-raising laws and regulations of this jurisdiction;

The Commission is of the opinion that a city councilwoman who is not currently running for office may serve as a host for your meet and greet without violating the aforementioned Rules.
