Dear

Your August 14, 2018 request for an advisory opinion was reviewed by the Judicial Investigation Commission. The facts giving rise to your request are as follows:

You are contemplating applying for a vacancy on the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia. The seat was vacated by Justice prior to the start of impeachment proceedings by the House of Delegates. You are also considering a run for the seat in the November 2018 general election. If you decide not to apply/run for the seat vacated by Justice , you are considering applying/running for any other vacancy that may/has occur(red) on the Court.

You want to know if your participation in the impeachment vote precludes you from applying/running for any vacancy on the Court. You did not preside over the impeachment proceedings before the house. Instead, you turned that task over to the Speaker Pro Tempore. You also asked to be excused from the August 13, 2018 impeachment vote in the full House concerning Justices

. However, due to a rule that requires members of a class possibly affected to vote, the President Pro Tempore required you to cast your ballot for/against the various articles of impeachment.

The Commission has reviewed Canon 4 of the Code of Judicial Conduct and can find no impediment to your applying/running for a vacancy on the Court since the impeachment proceedings are now in the breast of the State Senate. Therefore the

Commission is of the opinion that you may apply/run for a seat on the State Supreme Court.
