Dear

Your recent request for an advisory opinion was reviewed by the Judicial Investigation Commission. A chief probation officer is also a certified mentor for the Mountaineer Challenge Academy. A juvenile who is currently in detention awaiting placement has been given permission to apply for the Mountaineer Challenge Academy. If accepted, she will go on probation until she obtains her HiSet. She needs a female mentor and the chief probation officer wants to know if she can serve as the girl's mentor. She is not the probation officer assigned to the juvenile. You want to know if she can serve in that capacity.

The Commission is of the opinion that the Chief Probation Officer may serve as the juvenile's mentor for the Mountaineer Challenge Academy as long as she is screened from any participation as a probation officer in the juvenile's criminal case.

We hope that this opinion fully addresses the issue which you have raised. Please do not hesitate to contact the Commission should you have any questions, comments or concerns or desire additional advice.
