ORDER HOLDING IN ABEYANCE DEFENDANTS' MOTION TO COMPEL

RULE 30(b)(7) DEPOSITIONS OF PLAINTIFFS

This matter comes before the Discovery Commissioner on Defendants' Motion to Compel

Rule 30(b)(7) Depositions of Plaintiffs (Transaction ID 66022307). Having considered the

motion, responses, and the arguments of counsel the Discovery Commissioner finds that the

Plaintiffs have agreed to produce an individual from each Plaintiff for a Rule 30(b)(7) deposition

pursuant to the West Virginia Rules of Civil Procedure. The Discovery Commissioner further

finds that any limitations referred to in the parties' exhibits provided in the briefing are not

preconditions to Rule 30(b)(7) depositions, but rather, proposed limitations which may be

negotiated for inclusion in a Case Management Order. The failure of the parties to agree to a

deposition protocol in the Case Management Order shall not preclude a deposition from taking

place. Further the Discovery Commissioner notes that Plaintiffs' have filed objections to

numerous noticed topics of examination but indicate counsel continue to meet and confer on this

issue, therefore no decision on these objections will be ruled upon at this time, if an agreement

cannot be reached a supervised meet and confer will be scheduled.

Accordingly, the Discovery Commissioner hereby **Holds** the motion in **ABEYANCE**.

The parties are hereby **ORDERED** to continue to meet and confer in an effort to work

out the details of a deposition protocol and Plaintiffs' objections to the topics of inquiry of the

Rule 30(b)(7) depositions. IT IS SO ORDERED.
