## **ORDER**

On August 4, 2021, the petitioner, the County Commission of Tyler County, by D. Luke Furbee, Prosecuting Attorney, presented to the Court a petition praying for a writ of prohibition, to be directed against the respondents.

On September 27, 2021, the respondent, Antero Resources Corporation, by counsel, Ancil G. Ramey and John J. Meadows, Steptoe & Johnson PLLC, filed a response to the petition. On the same day, the West Virginia Chamber of Commerce, by counsel, Thomas J. Hurney, Jr. and Blair E. Wessels, Jackson Kelly PLLC; and the Defense Trial Counsel of West Virginia, by counsel, Mychal S. Schulz, Babst Calland and Todd A. Mount, Shaffer & Shaffer, PLLC, filed separate amicus curiae briefs in support of the respondent.

Upon consideration and review, the Court is of the opinion that a rule should not be awarded, and the writ prayed for by the petitioner is refused. See State ex rel. Appalachian Power Co. v. MacQueen, 198 W. Va. 1, 479 S.E.2d 300 (1996) applied in State ex rel. Allman v. MacQueen, 209 W. Va. 726, 551 S.E.2d 369 (2001).
