

New Family Court Judge in Northern Panhandle Schedules Investiture Ceremony

MOUNDSVILLE, W.Va. – Attorney David L. Jackson will be sworn in as a family court judge in the Second Family Court Circuit (Marshall, Tyler, and Wetzel Counties) in a ceremony at 11:30 a.m. on Friday, September 9.

Second Judicial Circuit Judge Jeffrey D. Cramer will deliver the oath of office during the ceremony in the circuit court courtroom in the Marshall County Courthouse in Moundsville. The event is open to the public.

On August 3, Governor Jim Justice appointed Mr. Jackson to fill the seat vacated by the retirement of Judge Robert C. Hicks.

Mr. Jackson is a native of Moundsville and is a 1988 graduate of West Liberty University and a 1992 graduate of the West Virginia University College of Law. He was also a 1979 recipient of the Golden Horseshoe Award.

At the time of his appointment, he was a staff attorney for Brooke and Hancock Counties for the West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources Bureau for Child Support Enforcement, a position he held since 2006.

Previously, he practiced law at Gardner and Jackson, PLLC, and Chase, Hyre, Gardner, and Whorton, PLLC, in Moundsville.

Jackson and his wife, Michele, live in Glen Dale. They have two children, Jami (Travis) of Wheeling and Michael (Rachel) of New Jersey, along with two grandchildren.
