JUDGMENT ORDER ON JURY VERDICT

Romano of Romano Law Office, LC, and came also the Defendants. Safeco Insurance Company of America and Liberty Mutual Insurance Company, by their designated representative, Aaron D. Ford, in person and with their attorney, William M. Harter, of Frost Brown Todd, LLC. The case having been matured for trial on said date, thereupon came a Jury consisting of the following named persons, who were duly selected according to law, and who were duly sworn to well and truly try the issues joined, and a true verdict rendered according to the evidence:

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The issues were tried before the Court and Jury on April 10, 2019 and April 11, 2019. Upon presentation of the Jury's verdict, punitive damage instructions were warranted. The Jury then returned to open court whereupon Plaintiffs called as a witness Defendants Liberty Mutual and Safeco's designated Corporate representative. Aaron D. Ford, whereupon the witness was examined by all Parties. Thereafter, the Court instructed the Jury regarding assessment of punitive damages and the Jury retired to their chambers to consider their verdict regarding punitive damages, and after some time, returned to the Court and upon their oaths presented their punitive damage verdict as stated below:

We, the Jury, after consideration of the factors set forth in the Court's Instructions, award punitive damages in the amount of $\frac{60.000.00}{}$.

Accordingly, it is ADJUDGED and ORDERED that the Plaintiffs, recover from the Defendants, Safeco Insurance Company of America and Liberty Mutual Insurance Company, jointly and severally, as compensatory and general damages, the sum of \$1,000.00, and as punitive damages, the sum of \$60,000.00, which results in a total judgment of \$61,000.00 which judgment shall bear post-judgment interest of \$7.52 per day, from and including April 11, 2019 until paid.

It is further ADJUDGED and ORDERED that the Plaintiffs shall recover their costs from the Defendants as taxable and assessed under the law of this State and Plaintiffs should provide to the Circuit Clerk a Bill of Costs within 10 days after the entry of this Judgment Order. The Defendants are also ORDERED to pay all costs as assessed by the Clerk as a matter of law for this Jury trial.

The objections and exceptions of the Defendants to this Judgment Order are noted herein.
