Justices Help State Bar Group Distribute Law Day Awards

CHARLESTON, W.Va. – Chief Justice Evan Jenkins, Justice Tim Armstead, and Justice John Hutchison on Monday helped the West Virginia State Bar Women in the Profession Committee congratulate inaugural Law Day contest award winners.

President Dwight D. Eisenhower founded Law Day in 1958 to celebrate the role of law in America. Law Day events are held on or near May 1. For the West Virginia Law Day contests, students had the option of using either the 2020 Law Day theme, “Your Vote, Your Voice, Our Democracy: The 19th Amendment at 100,” or the 2021 theme, “Advancing the Rule of Law Now.”

“The Rule of Law and women’s right to vote are so important to our state and nation. To everyone who participated, thank you on behalf of the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals,” Chief Justice Evan Jenkins said during the virtual event.

In January, the State Bar committee led by Twenty-Third Judicial Circuit (Berkeley, Jefferson, and Morgan Counties) Judge Bridget Cohee invited students across West Virginia to participate in contests in essay-writing, poetry, songwriting and performance, poster creation, and social media marketing. There were about 120 entries, and prizes were given for winners in three school levels (K-5, 6-8, 9-12) for each medium and overall. Prize packages and certificates were donated by the West Virginia State Bar and the Bar Associations of Cabell, Monongalia, and Harrison Counties.

Following the award presentation, Chief Justice Jenkins gave a virtual tour of the Supreme Court Chamber, Justice Armstead talked about the branches of government, and Justice Hutchison gave an overview of the levels of the West Virginia court system.
