RULE TO SHOW CAUSE

On May 10, 2024, the petitioner Office of Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, by Rachael L. Fletcher Cipoletti, Chief Lawyer Disciplinary Counsel, filed a petition for a rule to show cause to be directed against the respondent Phillip S. Isner, to show cause as to why he should not be held in contempt and why the respondent should not be suspended immediately and indefinitely until he has demonstrated full compliance with this Court's orders.

Upon consideration and review on October 30, 2024, the Court is of the opinion that a rule in contempt should be awarded. It is ORDERED that a rule does issue directed against the respondent Phillip S. Isner, returnable before this Court at its courtroom in the City of Charleston, County of Kanawha, on Tuesday, January 28, 2025, at 2:00 o'clock p.m., commanding and directing him to show cause, if any he can, why he should not be held in contempt of this Court, unless sooner mooted. The rule in contempt may be mooted only by the respondent showing *full compliance* with all portions of the Court's June 9, 2023 order entered in *Lawyer Disciplinary Board v. Isner*, No. 22-570
