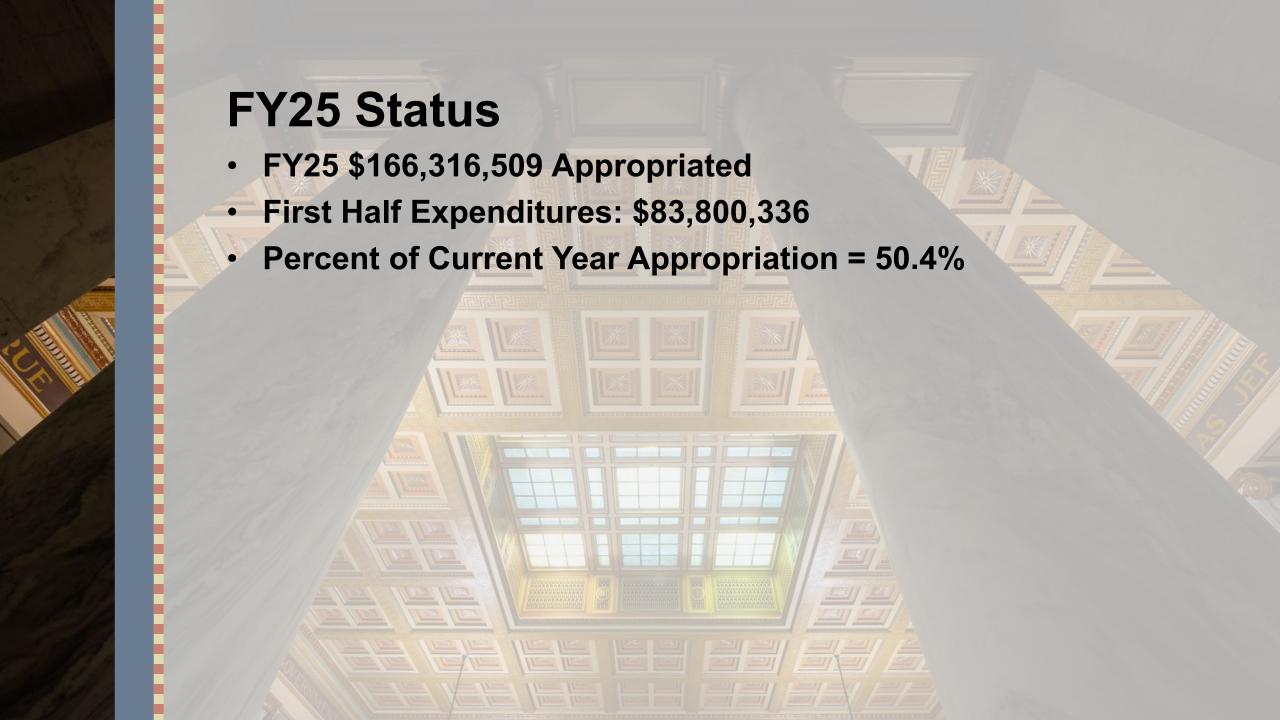

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 4-25

By the Governor

WHEREAS, much of the federal funding that the State of West Virginia received in recent years due to the COVID-19 pandemic is no longer available and cannot be relied upon in perpetuity; and

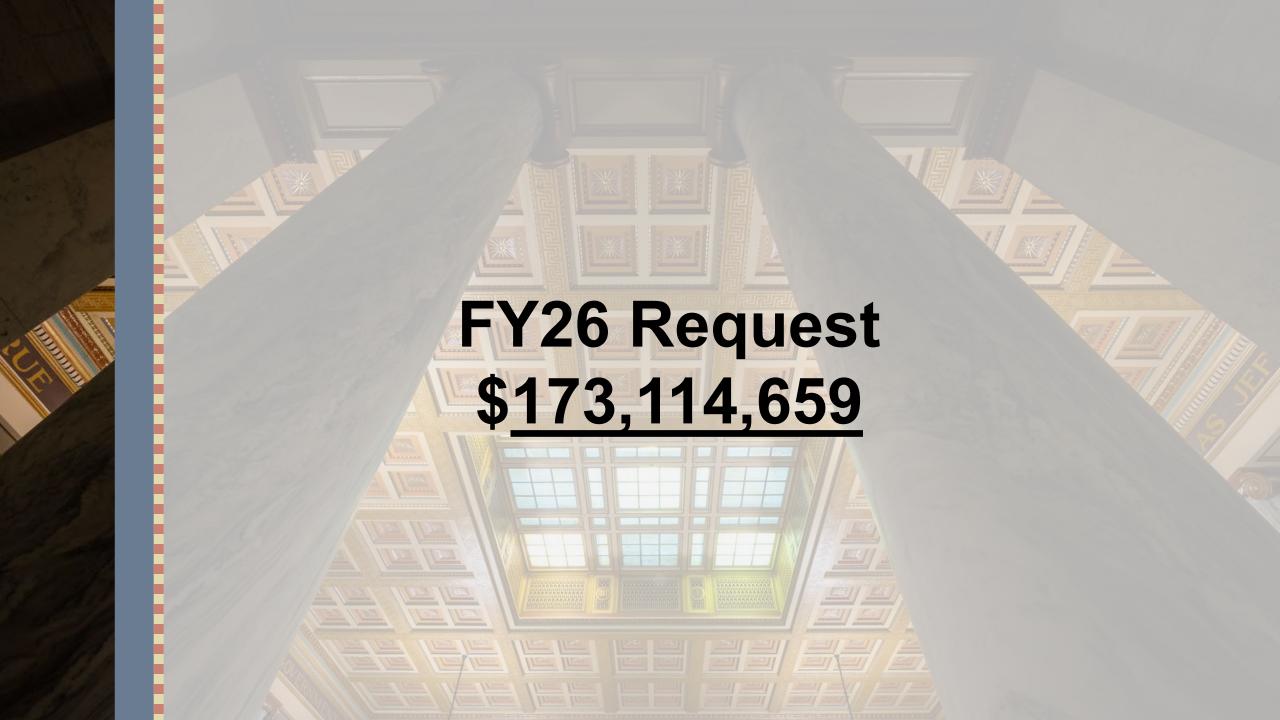
WHEREAS, there are currently a number of areas where anticipated expenditures for the 2026 fiscal year budget exceed available revenues; and

FY25 and FY26 Comparison

\$6,798,150 difference

Highlights:

- \$1,529,200 increase in PEIA employer premiums (per State Budget Office)
- \$2,067,575 increase due to 2023 HB 3332 (Judicial Realignment)
 - Full-year salary and benefits for 20 new FTEs in Circuit Court, 3
 new FTEs in Family Court, 20 new FTEs in Magistrate Court
 - FY 2025 budget included \$2,067,575 for half-year of expenses
- \$1,082,781 for continuation of Family Treatment Courts
- \$249,416 for 3 new probation positions
- \$154,615 for 2 new positions (1 Court Services & 1 HR)
- \$459,267 increase in BRIM premium
