Involuntary Commitment Video RFP Questions and Answers

- 1. What is the budget?
 - a. The budget is \$20,000 from a federal grant and cannot be exceeded.
- 2. When do you anticipate the draft script being ready for us to look at?
 - a. We anticipate finalizing the script shortly before shooting begins.
- 3. What are your casting needs?
 - a. The production company will supply the following cast members:
 - i. Off-screen narrator (no on-camera host). This will be all narration with no on-camera speaking parts.
 - ii. Respondent: Man in late 20s, early 30s (professional actor)
 - iii. Plaintiff: Woman or a couple who are the Respondent's parents (professional actor/actors)
 - b. We will supply the following cast members:
 - i. 911 operator
 - ii. Judge
 - iii. Magistrate
 - iv. Mental hygiene commissioner
 - v. Deputy
 - vi. Attorney for Respondent
 - vii. Prosecuting attorney
 - viii. Two psychologists/doctors
 - ix. Court reporter
- 4. What type of set/backdrop is needed? How will it be used?
 - a. No backdrop will be needed.
- 6. Does the Court have an Involuntary Commitment video currently in use or will this be the first video of its kind?
 - a. No. This will be the first.
- 7. How many filming locations do you envision?
 - a. There will be six general locations, which we will provide:
 - i. **House:** bedroom, kitchen, bathroom, computer at desk or table, driveway, car in driveway, and mailbox
 - ii. Offices: 7 different offices
 - iii. **Courthouse:** outside shot, hallway shot, hearing room, circuit clerk filing counter (prefer to shoot in Putnam County)
 - iv. **Hospital:** One room, several shots (we are working on securing this location)
 - v. **911 Center:** one quick shot
 - vi. Supreme Court: one quick shot
- 8. Where do you want to shoot? For example, is there a certain city or courthouse that needs to be featured in the production?
 - a. See above. The production company does not need to supply the locations.
