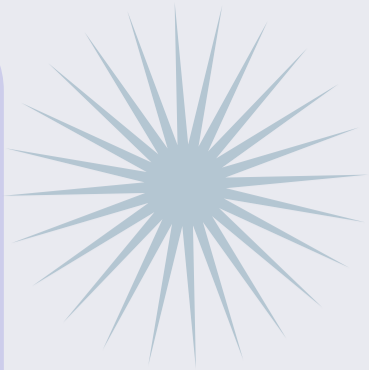

WORK CONTINUED ON MULTIPLE PROJECTS

- **New View:** 14 New referrals, 15 reviews completed
- **Missing From Care:** 59 interviews completed
- **156** Court Observations completed
- **66** MDT observations completed
- **7** new videos created highlighting abuse and neglect work



JUVENILE ABUSE AND NEGLECT INFORMATION SYSTEM (JANIS)



- **4,906** new cases added
- New user dashboard created
- **8** new users trained



EDUCATION AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH

- **10** lunch and learn sessions. **788** participants. **97%** would recommend CIP training. **88%** participants felt better equipped to do their job after the training.
- 3 judicial stakeholder meetings held (Calhoun, Randolph, Morgan)
- 9 New Magistrates trained on Title IV-E
- Supported Child Protection and the Law Course at WVU College of Law
- Provided support to train CASA volunteers
- Supported annual ESPN Conference
- Aided CHS in development of Human Trafficking Curriculum



OTHER CIP EFFORTS

- Supported 2 abuse and neglect externships in Spring 2022
- Supported the update/revision to the Child Abuse and Neglect Judicial Benchbook
- Provided start-up funds to the Parent Resource Navigator Program in Morgan County.
- Provided educational material to the Family Treatment Courts
- CIP staff participated in 2 CQI workshops and presented twice to national audiences
